## **UPCOMING ACTIONS**

Federalist Society NYC Annual Gala January 16 @ 5:30 Metropolitan Club: 60<sup>th</sup> Street and 5<sup>th</sup> Ave.

Jamie: Nikki Haley is the speaker. The Federalist Society is packing the courts. They have falsely been designated as a 501c3 as an "educational organization". Further discussion tonight and at Actions tomorrow.

Complicated message: We know what you are up to, and you are packing the courts and that is not what your mandate is. We will end the action when people stop arriving.

Plan: Either stand still in a string and shame people who enter, or if many activists attend, there will be a moving picket.

Question asked about the Proud Boys: they have not typically showed up at galas. We will respond as we do to hecklers. A good number of people from the floor said they could participate.

# **Climate Action Group updates**

Claire:

Action #1: **January 23**,12:30-2:00 at Chase Headquarters (390 Madison) inside lobby. RaR has become the prime entity to focus on Chase which is the largest banking investor in fossil fuels; we have vivid photographs of climate disaster

Slogans: "Chase funds climate crimes"

Question: A flyer indoors for Chase employees? Response: there is another movement in which people cut up their cards at Chase. #cutthecard.

Action #2: Pop-up actions at Chase branches; this will require a few people with banners and signs. To be decided: same day each week, or different days?

These will be non-arrest events

This will be a FB event; the goal is to compare effectiveness with non-FB events. Ask for \$400.

RaR voted to endorse Actions #1 and #2 RaR voted to release \$400 to these actions.

Sandy: National (as opposed to NY based) Chase initiatives

"Drown Jamie Diamond in paper": Goal is to send thousands of letters to Diamond on Jan 20. A large number of members agreed to write letters; Sandy will print out letters to bring to next RaR meeting.

# Albany legislative issues

Katrina: Met Council for Housing. Thursday 1/9 trip to Albany. Poor People's Campaign is sending busses leaving at 6:15 AM

Mary H: True Blue is meeting tomorrow Weds 1/8 at 7 pm; 99 Greenwich Street, 9th floor

Budget justice: raising taxes to cover needs. Thanks to Cuomo we have a 2% cap. Donna: Meeting tomorrow 1/8 in Albany: TPP. Focus will be on long term prison sentences. On Jan 20 there will be a trip up focusing on solitary confinement.

# Facilitation announcements; rent collected; January tasks Discussion of Trump's assassination of Qasem Soleimani and warmongering with Iran, Impeachment, and Senate Trial – how and where do we focus?

Jamie: Actions will propose an action Saturday 1/11. Original plan (developed in early December) was to focus on all the reasons that he should be impeached. Actions has not met for a long time, so we need to refocus following the assassination of Soleimani. Discussion:

- Under Reagan assassination was made illegal.
- We need to do something big. March this past Saturday was underwhelming, not huge, and didn't get coverage.
- Different perspective: Saturday march was large. But speakers were problematic, pushing their particular agendas; we need to work on our messaging.
- Worries about the draft: kids 18 or over have been made to register.
- Soleimani is a complicated, horrible person who has killed many people himself.
- Dread of impending war. Action is necessary.
- Administration members who want war, Pompeio, Bolton. Trump is skittish about war; demonstration could make a difference.
- We are in war all the time: we are in a 100 years war.
- Public opinion is against quagmires. Trump is aware of that. More progressive
  Democratic candidates are talking about endless wars, and military industrial complex.
  We should be taking on Republicans for being warmongers, destroying healthcare,
  women's rights, LGBTQ rights.
- Reluctance to be in coalition with UNAC.
- This war is about impeachment and removal. Strategy: link this to assassination in Iran. A larger coalition will take time to develop, of the kind that Leslie Cagan does.
- "War is not inevitable". This could be a good organizing principle. Take this to different groups, like Democratic Clubs.
- The press is now focusing on war and not on impeachment; this is exactly what press did in Iraq; take this directly to the media: NY Times is doing its both sides of the question.
- Different perspective: There is a "gentleman's agreement" among the press not to cover protests against the media.
- January 25 Global protest: No War on Iran. There are various sectarian groups leading, but also long term anti-war and pacifist groups. Should we focus on bringing in non-sectarian speakers?
- Call for a demonstration this Thursday 1/9 (Move On, Indivisible)
- We do small targeted actions very effectively.

- Is there some kind of synthesis?
- Do not include the impeachment message: keep the message clear and simple: No war in Iran.
- One option: demand that the assassination of Soleimani go to Congress for hearings.
- It is problematic to work in coalition with entities that reject voting.
- Ideas: Trump Tower; take over steps of Trump Hotel, Grand Central or other public space.
- There was consensus in the group for immediate action:
- What about Martin Luther King Day? Too far away/too soon. Concerns about coopting MLK day. What about collaborating with Black Lives Matter or other groups?
- Focus on proposals/recommendations
  - Show up at Schumer's office at 5 and go to Grand Central
  - o Direct action inside a location and larger outside demo
  - Trump Tower targeted action: tags Trump directly, and gets media attention.
  - Federal Hall by the George Washington statue
  - Start at Grand Central and then march perhaps to Trump Tower
  - Trump focused action: CD action. Remove Trump.
- Presidents Day 2/16, or 2/4: the State of the Union address.
- Times Square subway station; tie in with War Resisters League and Black Lives Matter
- Actions Committee will discuss this further: 256 West 38 at 6 pm Weds

Rules: Trump Tower is still the corporate headquarters, though Trump may be moving out. It is a public space. No signs, no chanting. You are not trespassing until they ask you to leave. RaR voted to support this action.
