Thursday, March 9 - Immigration Vigil in Grand Central

- Good turnout, and a lot of people stopped to chat. A few run-of-the-mill hecklers.
- Police asked us to pick our posters up off the floor, we said we've never had a
 problem with police about that before, and the cop walked away.
- Participants spoke to students from Italy and people from Germany, Egypt, the UK, and Ghana.

Friday, March 10 - Say Their Names

• Canceled due to weather again. Jenny and Ann are going to ask other people to join them in making the weather decisions.

Friday, March 10 - Roger Stone Protest

- A martini party was scheduled for felonious fop Roger Stone.
- The Little Italy venue was announced at the last minute.
- Lots of cops across the street and near the narrow stairs going to the basement room. A restaurant employee was told by a manager to "shove them" if the protestors got on the stairs.
- Protestors did not approach the stairs but braved the rain with signs including "Deranged Dandy," and did some chalking.
- Activists arrived at 6 PM, the event started at 7 PM, and Stone didn't arrive till 9 PM, after activists had left.
- "Twinks for Trump" organizer appeared to be the host.
- One woman was approaching the restaurant with a man, saw the protestors, said "Nope," and walked away.

Tuesday, March 14 - Truth Tuesdays at Fox, 12 PM - 1 PM

- Good turnout despite bad weather. Debuted new posters: Carlson, Hannity, Ingraham, and Murdoch heads with quotes from the Dominion lawsuit. Truth Tuesdays - didn't expect much turnout because of the weather.
- Three professional photographers were there and a camera crew from Showtime's political show "The Circus" turned up after finding the Facebook event page. They asked us to return tomorrow at 9 AM to shoot a promo.
- The episode airs on Sunday.
